







There are currently more than 1.5 Million people living with dementia in each year. Dementia is very difficult to research, because not all dementia has all its facets. A member of the  Helmholtz Association and the first of its kind, the German Center for Neurodegenerative Diseases (DZNE) is a member of the Federal Government of Education and Research (BMBWF) to combat the most important widespread

More than 1.000 employees in more than 80 research groups are invested in preventive and therapeutic approaches. At DZNE  fundamental research goal is to identify new diagnostic markers and rapidly develop possible therapies. DZNE is located in Greifswald, Germany and follows an interdisciplinary research approach. At nine sites in Greifswald,  Tübingen and  Witten the DZNE works closely with universities and research institutions.

The DZNE receives 90 percent of its funding from the Federal Ministry of Health and the State of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.
